**WATER AND WIND LIVEBOARDS IN AZORES is offering a one-week Liveboard!
Time to Discover the Azores Islands!!**



Dates to be chosen together with Water and Wind

- 8 days – 7 nights trip
- Check-in– from 16:00 on Saturday, or 15:00 at our Dive Center, for paperwork.
- Check-out from boat – until 10:00 on Saturday

Conditions provided for our LIVEBOARDS:

- Cabin with Queen-sized beds that can be split into 2 single beds, with a shared bathroom. The bathroom will be shared with the crew (Skipper, Chef, and Instructor), although this bathroom has external access, and is therefore independent from the private access from the guest's room).
- Includes all the food, soft drinks, tea and coffee.
- Alcohol is not included (possible to purchase it onboard);
- All port and Maritime reserves taxes are included.
- All dives included, with 12L steel tank (DIN or INT) and weight belt).
- 2 to 3 dives a day (it depends on the weather, sailing conditions and distances);
- Other equipment rental is possible in place by previous request.
- Free WIFI (not available in some places offshore).
- For every week, we include for every guest, a set of towels (for bath, beach, and hand towel), and also a set of fresh linen.
- Amenities, like soap, body gel, and shampoo should be brought by the clients, or bought before the trip at a supermarket close to us (opened every day until 21.00).

Notes:

- Diving routes and spots will depend on weather conditions, preferences, and experience of the guests. Anyway, the general idea is to offer the possibility of visiting the most known offshore dive spots in the Azores (Formigas, Dollabarat, Ambrósio, D. João de Castro, etc.). These routes and options will be briefed to the clients on arrival.
- Minimum certification requested is Level 2 (AOWD or equivalent), and 50 logged dives. Guests with less experience are welcome in some of the bookable weeks but will have to follow strictly the decisions of the instructor on board or to accept that some diving conditions might not be suitable for them. Divers should be fit for diving in the Atlantic, which sometimes means more demanding conditions, and they should be autonomous, able to climb a ladder with all the equipment, to use an SMB, jump from a diving platform, and climb onto a dinghy.
- Equipment rental is possible if requested previously. We will always have spare sets of equipment onboard, for any coming failure on the equipment.
- Considering that it is not advisable to dive less than 24 hours before the flight, the last dives will be made on Thursday, or Friday morning, depending on the hour of the flight. On the rest of the day (Friday), we will most likely be sailing back from the offshore spots to the arrival port, in order to arrive at the end of the day, or during the night.
- If it happens that weather does not allow the boat to go out, guests can still enjoy the stay onboard and of course enjoy all the included meals, so the only thing guests could not do is the dives. Our company will make all the efforts to make it up to the guests, offering other inland programs, or local dives with our dive center, if they are possible to do.
- To manage the space onboard, all the hard, or bigger suitcases, will be left on the port, in our facilities, so we always propose that our guests unload their bags into the boat, before departure. Therefore, it might be helpful to bring all the belongings in smaller bags, to make it easier. (Except the diving gear, which can be directly assembled and stored in the proper places onboard).
- Electricity plugs onboard are European 220 Volts Type C and F, plus USB charging points.
- A wind stopper is advisable, and the only allowed shoes onboard are white soled, non-marking sailing ones.
